Mosier Becomes City.

Mosier, Ore., Sept. 23.—An election was held here last Saturday to decide the question of incorporating the city of Mosier. There were 81 votes, of which 57 were favorable and 24 were against. A lively interest was shown by the women voters. Some were busily engaged in electioneering for their side of the question. This is the second election held here this year for the same purpose, the first resulting in a defeat owing to dissatisfaction over the boundary lines.

The election of municipal officers will be set by the county court at its next regular session, in October. A meeting of citizens soon will be held to discuss the form of government to be adopted for the new city.

Mosier has been growing rapidly for the past few years, and has reached the point where it is necessary to have some form of civic government to make certain much-needed improvements. The town was platted ten years ago by J. N. Mosier. It is the shipping point for the famous Mosier fruit district, and has the advantage of both rail and water transportation. Sufficient funds have been subscribed by residents to build a substantial dock on the Columbia river.

New Postmaster October 1.

Klamath Falls, Ore., Sept. 23.—W. A. Delzell has been named postmaster and will succeed C. K. Brandenburg on October 1. Charges had been preferred against Brandenburg and his removal was ordered. He refused to resign and asked for a hearing, which has not yet been granted. Brandenburg will not make a fight for the office, but will step out whenever his successor reports for duty.
