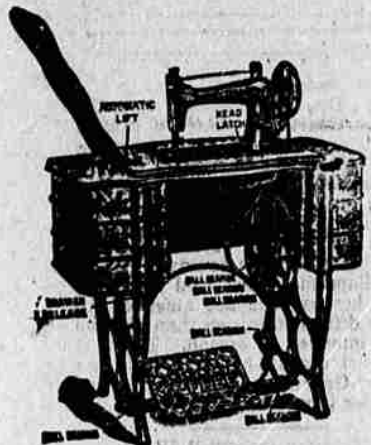

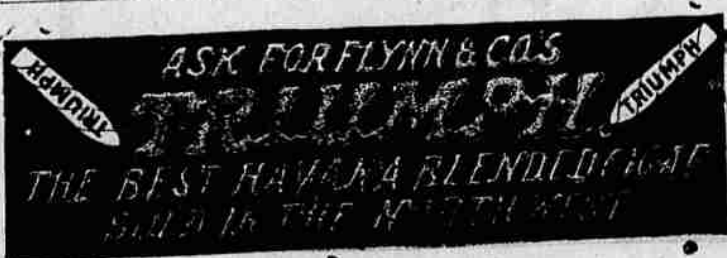

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Zealand Praises I. C. A. for Success in Life

On Way to San Francisco Farnet B. Holmes Stops Off in Scranton to See the Schools to Which He Owes His Success.

Grant B. Holmes, of Wellington, New Zealand, a man big in the world of electrical engineering, is in La Grande. In an interview he told an interesting story of himself and said that the International Correspondence schools should be credited with his success.

He was a locomotive engineer when he first heard of the I. C. S. He was interested in electricity and he took

the I. C. S. course in electrical engineering. He soon got into business for himself and was a success. Leaving his home in New Zealand he went to London, where he again set up in business and placed on the market a new trolley wheel. It was a big improvement on the old wheel and it was not long before his patent was adopted by practically every trolley line in England.

Mr. Holmes has already interested considerable New York and Cleveland capital in the patent.

Will Call On Foster.
Mr. Holmes intends to call on President T. J. Foster, of the I. C. S. today. He wants to pay a visit to the institution which has made him the successful man he is. He is very much interested in the new agricultural college in New Zealand.

Some weeks ago he came to this country to try and interest American capital in another of his inventions--a course the I. C. S. is soon to put out. He says his father is one of the commissioners of agriculture in New Zealand and he expects that the commissioners will investigate the new I. C. S. course with a view to putting it into the agricultural colleges in New Zealand.

Mr. Holmes will remain in the city for a few days and will then begin a tour to San Francisco by automobile. He will spend some time on the Pacific coast and will then go on to New Zealand to visit his old home. Scranton, Pa., Times, Sept. 8.
