THE U. S. FIGHTS MALARIA.

Washington, Sept. 26.—With two of
its most eminent sanitation experts—
battle scarred veterans of a hundred
wars against disease—already in the
field, the United States Public Health
service is today engaged in the most
scientific engagement since inception
of the war against the hated mosquito
and its child, malaria. Other experts
are held in readiness and the service is
listening with hand to ear prepared to
invade the mosquito ridden sections of
the country as it has already done in
the cases of calls for assistance from
the health authorities of North Caro-
lina, Alabama and Mississippi.

The cotton mill sections of these
states are in the grasp of malaria epi-
demics unprecedented. Unable to
handle the situation themselves the
state health officers appealed to the
Public Health service.

Co-operation with the health offi-
cers of North Carolina is Assistant
Surgeon H. R. Carter, one of the men
who drive yellow fever from New Or-
leans and Cuba. Extensive sanita-
tion surveys of the affected districts
are under way and already in many
districts mosquito breeding pools have
been "dry cleaned" and malaria has
died with the mosquitos. Parallel
work is being carried on in Alabama
and Mississippi under the supervision
Surgeon H. R. Carter, one of the men
famous work in Havana during the
"fever days" was a potent factor in
restoring the health and commerce of
the port.

Malaria is directly traced to "ano-
pheles." The latter is a living animal
parasite. It is transmitted to humans
by mosquito bite. The mosquito's
breeding haunt is stagnant water.
Stagnant water is the result of hu-
man carelessness. And human care-
lessness is directly responsible for the
mosquito, the "anopheles" and result-
ant malaria. On this theory, which has
been proved to be correct by medical
research, the experts are on a cam-
paign of education. Lectures are be-
ing made in the many districts em-
bracing a direct appeal to the people
to eliminate the basic evil of malaria.
Educational lectures on scientific dis-
coveries, the Public Health service be-
lieves, coupled with an appeal for pre-
caution, is the most effective weapon
that can be wielded against the dis-
ease.

Reports from Surgeons Carter and
Von Ezzdorf show that their educa-
tional campaigns have brought results in
the already "dry cleaned" districts.

Joy Ride Ends In Grief.

Pendleton, Sept. 23.—Guy Connerly,
who has been operating an auto for
hire here for the past year or so, is
today without the means of his liveli-
hood as a result of the escapade of
some joyriders yesterday morning, an
escapade that may result seriously for
the offenders. Some time after mid-
night the auto was stolen from the
Long Bros. garage and driven out up-
on the Tutuilla road where it caught
fire and burned.

The theft and ruined machine were
discovered yesterday morning but the
perpetrators of the deed have not yet
been apprehended. However, the of-
ficers are on their trail and believe
they will have them in custody before
many hours. The offense is punish-
able by a term in the penitentiary.

Indications are that the automobile
balked on the Tutuilla road about two
miles from the city and took fire from
an explosion of gasoline. All of the
woodwork of the machine was destroyed
by the fire. The auto was a Ford.
The thieves either had a key to the
lock of the garage or used a big
wrench in taking it off. They took
the lock with them.

WILD ANIMAL SHOW COMING.

Barnes Troupe of Wild Animals Com-
ing to This City.

The Queen of the menagerie of the
A. G. Barnes big three ring wild ani-
mal circus, which will exhibit in La
Grande October 11th, is "Mistress
Nell," a full blooded, forestbred Amer-
ican lioness.

"Mistress Nell" owes her popular-
ity among the owners and attaches to
the fact that she is the only lioness
of the half hundred owned by the
show that can be trusted to rear their
young. It is the rule with mothers
of wild beasts born in captivity to de-
stroy their offspring at the first ap-
proach of human beings, and great
care must be experienced in removing
the cubs from the den in which they
were born. After they have been tak-
en away from the mother they are
provided a wet nurse, if one is avail-
able, from among the canine depart-
ment, or are turned over to Mlle. Flor-
ine, the principal female trainer of the
show, who raises them on a bottle
with rations of malted milk and gen-
erous feeds of baby food. The off-
spring of "Mistress Nell" need no
such artificial nourishment, as she can
be depended upon to take the best of
care of her babies, and at present is
exhibited at every performance with
her four young lusty cubs, who ar-
rived about three weeks ago.
