

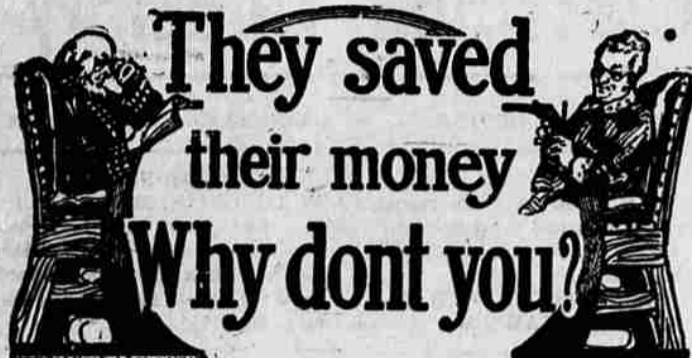

BUSINESS MEN ENJOY TRIP TO ENTERPRISE YESTERDAY

With a special program staged for the La Grande delegation which about 150 strong visited Enterprise on a special train yesterday, the Wallowa County Fair association acquitted itself in a remarkable manner and sent its visitors home delighted and with the very kindest words for the hospitality of the sister county and complimentary words for the exhibits that are forming the background for the best fair ever held in that county.

With almost one hundred and fifty La Grande people including representatives of most of the business houses, the special train on the O.-W. R. & N. branch line left here yesterday morning for Enterprise where the passengers on the special went to attend the opening day of the great Wallowa county fair.

W. R. Parker was at the throttle, J. T. Richardson carried the ticket punch, Joe Kenney and Passenger Agent Jim Miller were general utility men, and with Fireman Head and Brakemen Driscoll and Millering, the crew was complete to make the round trip to the neighboring county without mishap and as nearly on schedule

time as an excursion train was ever run.

The entire tainload of people were feeling fine. They were taking a day off and at the same time attending a neighboring celebration. There was nothing but good humor abroad, but there was plenty of that.

Band Is the Live Card.

The La Grande band was on board with the "bells," and bass drum and a lot of brass and reed instruments, all of which had been properly tuned and pitched before Prof. Dade Haines announced that his section was in readiness. And the band proved the life of the occasion, "Franka Bay and Jima Snodgrass" were on the job every minute and all other members had the same spirit.

"It beats any stimulant for an excursion I have ever experienced," remarked one merchant who knows a whole lot about excursions.

From the moment Engineer Parker whistled "out of town" in the morning there was music in the air. When Elgin was reached Mayor Frank Smith, Postmaster Bob Mays, Sam Brunaugh, Bert and Ray Hug and a lot more of the boys could not resist the temptation and they boarded the special train.

At Wallowa special music was rendered to Father Murphy and his big crowd, and when Enterprise was reached the La Grande band headed the marching column and the visitors took the town. Editor Cheney, Carl Rowe, Dan Boyd and Asa Miller threw up their hands exclaiming "It's La Grande, by ginger; they have made good their promise to come, and now the town is their."

The afternoon at the fair grounds was pleasantly spent and the La Grande people learned a lot of Promise, Troy, Flora, Imnaha, Joseph, Lostine and Wallowa from the splendid exhibits representing these sections. The live stock display is especially fine, as also is the poultry, grains and fruits.

A rain the day before made the race track very heavy and all harness races had to be declared off. But the association made up a special program of buckaroo stunts, bulldogging the steer, roping contests and other events which were well put on. In fact, Pendleton, Walla Walla and Cheyenne had better look well to their laurels in these round-up events else Enterprise will be grabbing some of the championships and starting a school to teach some of those who now draw salaries in these lines.

Leaving at 5:30 in the evening the party returned home without accident and with a feeling of decided satisfaction at having gone. The band continued its excellent service on the homeward journey and made the trip a splendid one.

Baker Takes Up Plans for Giving Better Police Protection.

Baker, Oct. 1.—The matter of better police protection for Baker was the subject of discussion at the meeting of the city commissioners yesterday afternoon.

Although no definite action was taken, several excellent suggestions were offered, the most feasible one being that a night man and day man be kept at the station at all hours equipped with a motorcycle to answer special calls, while the regular policemen were on their beats.

Another suggestion was to keep all policemen at the station instead of patrolling the streets, but many objections to this scheme were met with, as it was pointed out that the officers could in no way detect a fire or catch a hold-up from the station.

It is probable that definite action on the matter will be taken at an early date.
