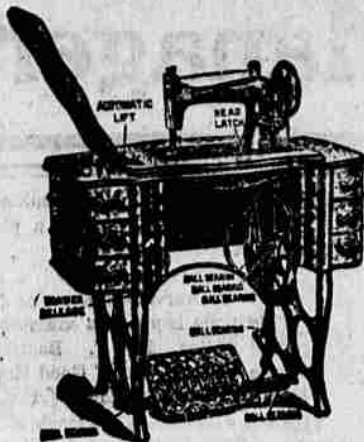

NATIONAL DAY FOR APPLES

NOVEMBER 18 IS APPLE EATING DAY

Entire Nation to Eat Apples on That Day Especially.

Portland, Or., Oct. 1.—If you don't eat an apple November 18th, some other fellow will get your share. That is the day that has been designated as National Apple day. It will be the time when the great National Apple Show will be held this year at Spokane and there is every indication at this time that the show will be the best ever held and the quality of exhibits will far eclipse anything heretofore gathered in the world.

Leading health authorities of the country have put their shoulder to the wheel to make this year's apple day a day of health. Every apple consumed will be a knock at the doctor's income for the best known of all food products is known to be a tonic that will make the sick well and the well that much better.

A number of the leading states in the country have already decided to celebrate apple day November 18th, and there is reason to believe that all will join in line by the time the date arrives. Washington especially will have cause to celebrate the day because of the holding of the apple show at Spokane.

Oregon will celebrate the day because the very first suggestion of a general apple day was made in this state two years ago.

California will celebrate the day because its apple interests are expanding and the public there really likes the taste of the fruit.

At the home of the government, Washington, D. C., there will be a celebration of the day because at that time the American Demological Society, the Society of Horticultural Science, the Eastern Fruitgrowers' Association and the Northern Nut Growers' association will hold their meeting there. In fact Washington, D. C., is going to go the rest of the country one better by designating the entire week, November 17 to 22 as "Fruit Week."

Assistant Postmaster, William J. Colkett, of Seattle has joined the boosters for the apple day celebration by suggesting that all retailers of apples assist in the celebration of Apple Day by providing themselves with apple cartons of various sizes and otherwise suitable for transportation through the mails when filled with apples, and fill them with one, two, three or more of the best obtainable specimens of the leading varieties of apples grown in the Pacific northwest, and have them ready for addressing, stamping and mailing, so that all persons desiring to participate in the celebration may readily purchase samples of our best apples and send them by parcel post to their friends and acquaintances in the east and elsewhere, and help to advertise the Pacific northwest as the greatest apple producing section of the world.
