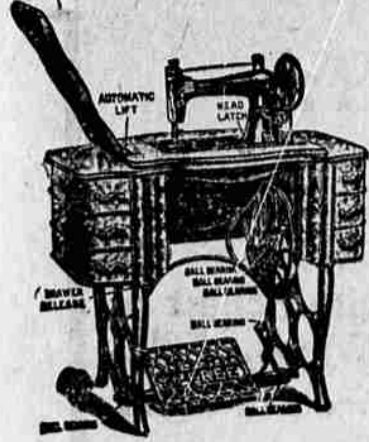

## MARKETS LOCAL AND STATE

### CATTLE ARE POOR TRADERS

**HOGS HAVE SLIGHTLY FIRMER PRICE IN MARKET.**

Review of Past Week Shows Little of Stellar Nature in Portland.

Portland Union Stock Yards, North Portland, Or., Oct. 6.—(Special)—Receipts for last week have been: cattle, 1271; calves, 26; hogs, 2120; sheep, 1478. A very unsatisfactory trade existed in cattle last week from a seller's standpoint. There had been a very slow demand for beef, especially the half fat stock being marketed. Outlet for any quantity in large incapacitated. Prime steers, top at \$7.65, shows the weakness. Good cows at \$6.85 featured, but bulk of the stuff was sold \$6.00 to \$6.50. Butcher trade generally a shade firmer than steers.

Market for well finished swine had been a degree firmer, and \$8.50 to \$8.60 was bid freely for this class, with a few extra choice loads going at \$8.75. Much flabby pork is being liquidated and killers manifest slight interest. Receipts were larger than for last week. Eight dollars and sixty cents can be considered extreme top at last week's close.

The sheep house had an active business Tuesday and Wednesday but has quieted down since. Some real choice ewes selling at \$3.80 and \$4.00 and a few yearlings at \$4.25 to \$4.50 featured the mutton trade. Lambs were steady at \$5.00 to \$5.25. Receipts were so large that the yards were nearly swamped and a weakening of present price range would occasion little surprise.

people began to bring their vegetables, live stock, poultry, domestic science and manual training articles in and prepare the for their display. By noon nearly everything was in its place and ready for the inspection for the large crowd that came out to view it. The vegetable, fruit and cereal display was as good as many county fairs have and it had all been raised by the youngsters themselves. There was dozens of platters of fruit and jellies and cakes and canned vegetables put up by little misses ranging in age from five to 20 years of age. Any of the display in this line would have done credit to the practiced housewife. The sewing show by the different grades was simply fine. The domestic science and manual training are a good thing; investment to the Union schools. The manual training display was good and it would have been much better if the pupils had been given more time. A fine oak table made by Morton Davis was the object of much comment. It shows what can be done on these lines and the young man is to be congratulated on his fine workmanship. General Goodbrod acted as judge of the manual training articles, vegetables, live stock, etc., assisted by L. L. McKenyon, while Mrs. Jennie Davis was the judge of domestic science, sewing, etc., assisted by Miss Georgia Wright. The display of cakes, breads, biscuits, butter and pies, as well as canned fruit, vegetables, and jellies was very large and as fine a display as one could ask for.

The cart offered by Smith & Cadwell, which was given for the best general display, was won by the Thomas Brothers. The Miller Brothers were a close second and it was a hard matter for the judge to decide between the two exhibits. The young people had quite a large display of poultry and their pets showed that they had good care and attention.

One table was given up to old antique and relics and was an object of interest to all. Mrs. Coombs and her daughter had a fine display of hand painted dishes and fine fancy work on exhibition. Miss Pierce and the young ladies of the domestic department served dainty refreshments to all, consisting of cocoa and wafers. There was a large crowd present and exclamations of surprise and pleasure were heard on every hand as to fine exhibits made by the young people. The Commercial club will see that the exhibit will be forwarded to the county fair at La Grande. If this is done other towns will have to look to their laurels on school fairs or Union will carry off the prize.
