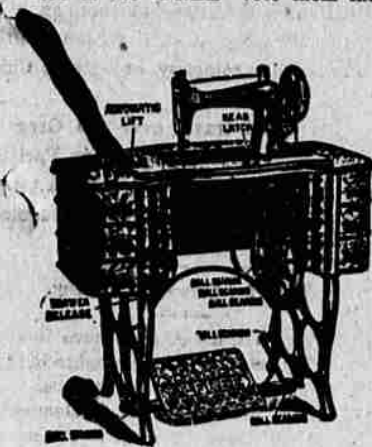

## AFRICA LIKES THE JONATHAN

NORTHWESTERN FRUIT GROWERS' PRODUCTS FIND SALE.

"Skookum" Label Brings an Answer of "Bully" From New Yorkers.

#### REGULAR APPLE SALES ON.

Home grown apples which have been of the best grade all this season, are now in the markets in box quantities and the selling of green or ripe apples by the pound is almost over. Winter supplies of this fruit are being laid in and a brisk sale is reported from both wholesalers and retail merchants.

Portland, Or., Oct. 14.—So well pleased have South African buyers become over their purchases of apples in the Pacific Northwest this season that it is likely that practically all the foreign apples hereafter bought for that market will come from this section.

The Northwestern Fruit Exchange of this city secured some rather liberal business this season from Johannesburg parties. This was their first experience, with the fruit from this section and they are mighty glad that they made the experiment. All told the South African parties purchased 25 cars of apples in the Pacific Northwest.

Prior to coming here they had purchased about 75 cars at Nova Scotia as in former years they had purchased all their requirements there. Hearing even in Nova Scotia of the wonderful fruit of the Pacific Northwest, the Johannesburg parties took the first train for Portland and soon made their initial purchases. The last shipment of Pacific Northwest apples to South Africa will be made via Montreal, October 28th.

The fact that the new fruit crop of their home sections comes into the markets about the turn of the year precludes further purchases for this season here.

The first carload of Jonathan apples marketed under the "Skookum" label of the Pacific Northwest, has reached New York and a wire to this city says that the stock was in "bully" condition. Such expressions from the New York trade for anything except the leading varieties of apples really means something. It indicates that after all the quality of Pacific Northwest fruit is breaking a few records.

## WITHYCOMBE GIVES VALUES

AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS WILL AMOUNT TO \$200 A PERSON.

Sends an Itemized Statement of the Valuations of Oregon Agriculture.

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Or., Oct. 14.—(Special)—The sum of \$200 for every man, woman and child in Oregon would be their share of the value of the state's agricultural products for the present year, if distributed equally among them. The valuation of farm products is almost \$140,000,000, according to the estimates of Dr. James Withycombe, director of the experiment station, and the population is slightly under 100,000. If the number of farmers in the state is 50,000, perhaps an over estimate, the average share of the farmer is about \$2,800.

The exact valuation placed upon farm crops by Dr. Withycombe is \$74,099,165, and the value of other agricultural products is estimated at \$65,405,500. The grand total is \$139,505,326. This is almost \$14,000,000 greater than the valuation last year, and indicates great prosperity. The average Oregon farmer seems to be getting beyond the reach of hard times. The itemized estimates are as follows:

Pipe Overflow to Roundup Park. (Pendleton East Oregonian.)

To pipe the overflow from the new reservoirs to Round-up Park for the filling of the artificial lakes was the proposition up before the city water commission for discussion last evening, and the commissioners view the proposed plan favorably providing the Round-up board showed a willingness to pay a portion of the cost.

When the gravity water system is completed there will be a big overflow of pure water from the reservoirs on the south hill and it has been the purpose of the commission to pipe this in a straight line to the river. However when the Round-up directors commenced excavating for artificial lakes at the park they conceived the idea of utilizing the overflow for furnishing the lakes with an everchanging supply of fresh water. The matter was proposed to the commission last night and it was the sense of that body that the city would be willing to pay for the laying of the pipe toward the park along a distance equal to the distance between the reservoirs and the river.

A line will be run from the reservoirs to the park and an estimate made of the cost of a terra cotta pipe. Roughly speaking it is believed that, if the Round-up board accepts the commissioners' terms, it will cost in the neighborhood of \$6000.
