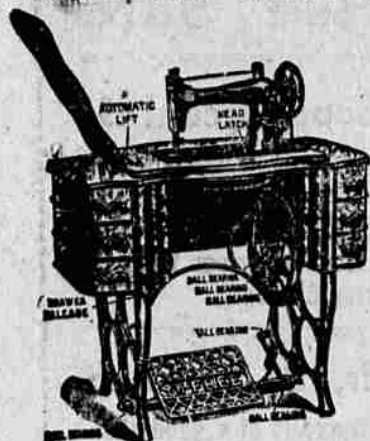

OREGON NEWS BREVITIES

Presbytery In Session.

Albany, Or., Oct. 14.—The fall meeting of the Willamette presbytery convened at the First Presbyterian church in this city today and will adjourn tomorrow at noon. About 40 ministers and laymen are in attendance from other valley points. This evening Rev. John Parsons, D. D., of Eugene, will address a public gathering on "Government by Instruction." On Tuesday Rev. H. M. Sharp, of Albany College, will read a paper on "The Bible and the Christian College," Rev. C. F. Koehler, of Brownsville, will also have a paper on "The Bible as a Force in Education."

14 Carloads of Hops Shipped.

Monmouth, Or., Oct. 14.—One of the largest shipments of hops this season was one made from Independence to New York. The consignment consisted of 14 cars, each containing 18,000 pounds, making a total of 252,000 pounds, or 1525 bales. The shipment included hops from the largest yards of the county where the yield was exceptionally good this year.

Sawmill Shut Down.

Roseburg, Or., Oct. 14.—The Gardiner Mill company has closed its plant for six weeks, after having operated every day for two years. During this time the mill has cut on an average almost 100,000 feet of lumber daily. Need of repairs and a poor market are the causes for the action. The little town of Reedsport, across from Gardiner, will soon have a gravity system of city water, from Clear lake, four miles from the town.

Will Exhibit at Chicago.

Salem, Or., Oct. 14.—Marion county's contribution to the Oregon exhibit to be sent to the United States land show, to be held at Chicago, will consist of a handsome exhibit of fruits and grains, according to Fred Brown, secretary of the Commercial club. Entering into the exhibit will be a large number of the products shown by the county at the state fair.

May Recover From Wound.

Salem, Or., Oct. 14.—Attending physicians now entertain hopes that George Staniff, who was shot Thursday by George Temple an escaped Indian boy from the Chemawa Indian school, will recover. The boy shot Staniff with a .22 caliber rifle, the bullet entering the man's breast.

Unions Indorse Commissioner.

Salem, Or., Oct. 14.—Resolutions indorsing Labor Commissioner Hoff for insisting what the state board of control observe the eight hour law as to labor at the state institutions have been passed by the Salem trades and labor council. To determine whether the bill really applies to labor at the state institutions, Governor West has asked Attorney General Crawford for an opinion. Should it be applicable it will raise the maintenance cost of the institutions thousands of dollars.

Bourne to Address Salem Club.

Salem, Or., Oct. 14.—The Salem Commercial club will hold a special meeting at 8 o'clock tomorrow evening for the purpose of listening to former Senator Jonathan Bourne, Jr., who will explain his plan for Federal aid to good roads. The officers of the club have promised a good attendance.

Little Interest In Election.

Monmouth, Or., Oct. 14.—Registration in Polk county for the coming November election has been slow, not much interest being shown. Those taking any interest are new residents. The women in the various districts seem to take but small interest in the election since few have registered.

D'Arcy Is Re-Elected.

Salem, Or., Oct. 14.—Judge P. H. D'Arcy, grand master of Oregon, was re-elected as chairman and S. A. McFadden was re-elected as secretary, at the district convention held here Saturday by the A. O. U. W.

Vicious Horse Kicks Owner.

Canyonville, Or., Oct. 14.—George W. Puckett was seriously kicked by a vicious horse this morning. Yesterday the same horse kicked at Mrs.

Puckett and narrowly missed striking her with both feet.
