## WARNER AND JACKSON MIX

### SLUG FEST TERMINATES WALLA WALLA BOUT.

Men Who Met in La Grande Last Winter Have Lively Rumpus.

Walla Walla, Oct. 16.—The wrestling match between Ed Warner formerly of La Grande, and Ben Jackson at the Keylor Grand theatre last night nearly ended in a rough and tumble fight between the two men and later friends of the wrestlers "chewed the rag" until the disturbance was quelled by Officer Buck who was detailed on duty at the wrestling bout. Warner and Jackson wrestled at La Grande last winter.

The men had been wrestling about seven minutes when the two began mixing it freely. Some of Jackson's friends of Dayton began cheering their man on and this nettled Warner. The bout grew rough and in a

minute Warner had struck Jackson a couple of body blows. Jackson doubled up his fist and threatened to retaliate when Referee Robinson stepped between them. For a few seconds it looked as if it would develop into a slugging match when Jackson walked to his corner and taking up his bathrobe left the ring. The crowd was in an uproar instantly and Referee Robinson walked to the front of the ring and disqualified both men.

Friends of the Dayton wrestler claimed that Robinson gave Jackson the match but later the referee said that he had disqualified both men and had declared all bets off. Immediately after Jackson left for the dressing room the ring swarmed with spectators and many an exciting argument ensued. Finally the talk became so boisterous that Officer Buck took a hand and cleared the stage, while the stage hands "doused" the lights.

Both Jackson and Warner were in the pink of condition and spectators deplored the fact that the men became excited and lost their heads.

Both men were lightning fast. Jackson stripped the heaviest and showed great form but Warner was as strong as an ox and wriggled out of tight places with ease. At no time

was either man in danger of a fall and it began to look as if the first fall would be a long dragged out affair. After the bout Carl Nelson and Warner both issued challenges to wrestle Jackson. A match may be arranged between the two men later.
