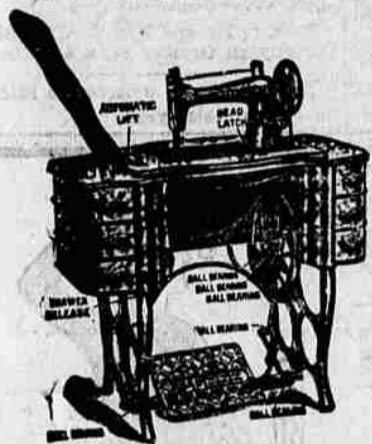

JOSEPH BOY PASSES AWAY

POPULAR STUDENT'S DEATH BRINGS SADNESS.

Personal Mention of Joseph Residents Coming and Going.

Wallowa, Or., Oct. 17.—Lorraine A. Brooke, the 15-year-old son of M. C. Brooke of Joseph, was brought to the Wallowa hospital Monday morning, and died within nine hours after arriving. The boy was in such a precarious condition that an operation would have been of no avail. The body was taken to the undertaking parlors and embalmed and was shipped to Joseph Tuesday for burial.

About three years ago the boy complained of intestinal trouble and it was feared that he had appendicitis, but this trouble disappeared and since that time he enjoyed reasonably good health. He grew very rapidly, and it may be that this had something to do in bringing on his future trouble.

Last Friday for the first time the trouble assumed a serious nature and medical attention was given him. He gradually grew worse, until Monday morning, when it was decided to take him to the hospital in Wallowa for an operation. Mrs. F. D. McCully took the sick boy and his parents to Wallowa in her auto, arriving there about noon. Dr. Gregory of the hospital, decided that the boy was too weak to stand an operation at that time, and hoped that within a couple of days he might be strong enough to undergo the ordeal. He failed to rally, and died Monday evening at 9:45.

Lorraine O. Brooke was born in Barton county, Mo., February 19, 1898, and died Oct. 13, 1913, at the age of 15 years, 7 months and 28 days. He was an unusually bright and cheerful boy and idolized by his parents, brother Arville and sister Mina, who are heartbroken over their terrible misfortune.
