CRANBERRIES ARE PLENTIFUL

FIFTEEN CENTS STRAIGHT IS
PREVAILING PRICE.

Celery Offered in Two Varieties,
Costing 10 and 15 Cents.

Preparatory to the Thanksgiving demand, all grocers are stocking up well with cranberries. Fifteen cents straight is the prevailing price and the quality is up to a good standard generally.

Two grades of celery, another Thanksgiving requisite, are offered and one grade brings 15 cents and another 10 cents. One sort is home grown, the other shipped in.

There as comparatively few changes today in grocery lines, the principal changes of the past few days being the drop in sugar.

A new shipment of the famous Jones home made sausage has been received and was put on sale this morning. Last year E. E. Polack received the first shipment of these sausages and introduced to La Grande ladies the now famous sanitary Jones products.
