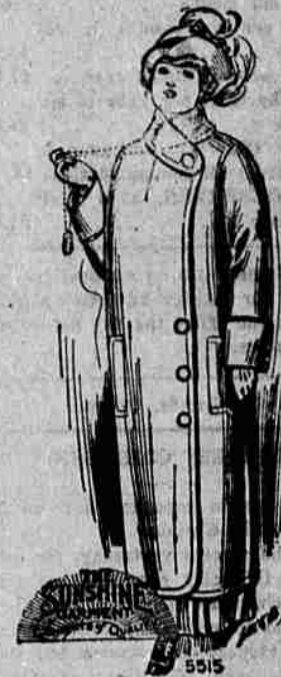

PRACTICALLY ALL THE SCHOOLS HAVE BEEN INSPECTED. County School Superintendent Finds Union County Schools Active.

Since her appointment to the office of county superintendent of schools, Mrs. F. S. Ivanhoe has visited nearly one-third of the county's schools. In an interview this afternoon Mrs. Ivanhoe had this to say of the condition of the schools, the pupils and the teachers: "I have visited a goodly number of the schools and find all of them doing well. The present condition of the schools is due to the efficient work of my predecessor and the untiring efforts of the teachers to put the schools on a high plane. Of course there are some places where things will have to be remedied, conditions that are not the result of any ones mismanagement but are rather the outgrowth of things almost beyond the control of those in authority. As time goes on and things shape themselves in such a manner that my presence in the better schools will not be required I will have more time to strengthen the weak spots. I love the work and feel that I am doing something eminently constructive. It is a noble occupation and one worthy of the best energy. "The pupils evince a great deal of eagerness to perform the tasks assigned to them and I am sure such an attitude on their part cannot but be productive of a great deal of good. The teachers are full of energy and have taken hold of the task with a determination and a willingness to make the schools the pride of the state. I am highly pleased with the results so far and hope that my connection with the education of the

youth of the county will ever be one of the most consoling factors of my life."
