Moderator From Baker.

Baker, Oct. 21—Rev. Ward W. MacHenry, pastor of the Presbyterian church of this city, at the joint convention of the Washington-Oregon synod held at Portland last week, was elected to the office of Moderator of the La Grande Presbytery, the highest district office in the gift of the convention, bestowing a high honor on the Baker pastor.

Mr. MacHenry attended the convention as the ministerial delegate of the local church, while Lee C. Bell was the lay delegate. The latter went from Portland to Corvallis to visit relatives and is not expected home until the last of the week.

Mr. MacHenry states that the meeting was one of the most successful ever held and the first time in 19 years that the Oregon and Washington synods have met in joint session. Over 400 delegates were present.
