

WALLOWA HAS BETTER WATER

SYSTEM IS IMPROVED BY BUILDING INTAKE.

High Water and Frost Will Not Menace City Further.

Wallowa, Ore., Oct. 30.—Anticipating the freezing weather of the coming winter and the high water of early spring, the work of repairing the city water system at the intake at Bear creek, is rapidly approaching completion. City Marshal Henry Spence, who states that the system is now in better condition than at any time in the past. A new concrete dam at the intake of the channel of the creek is at a point just above the James Hayes place, southwest of town. There has always been considerable difficulty

with this dam, and last spring it was completely washed out. During the summer the water has been taken into the main at the old intake, a mile down the stream from the intake that was washed out. No further difficulty is expected, as the new dam is supposed to stand any possible high water on Bear creek.
