Birds Commence to Show Themselves in Markets on Small Scale.

No particular market news prevails today in La Grande except that sweet potatoes are just a shade higher and cabbage has gone up a half cent a pound. Sweet spuds no longer sell for six pounds for a quarter, but go at five cents straight.

All the delicacies needed for pre-Thanksgiving dinners, or for Thanksgiving dinners themselves in fact, are now well stocked up by grocers, and any fastidious housewife could procure the wherewithal right now to serve everything but the meat course. Turkeys and ducks and other Thanksgiving birds are commencing to show themselves occasionally but the market has not really opened up yet. A little later the markets will carry full lines.
