

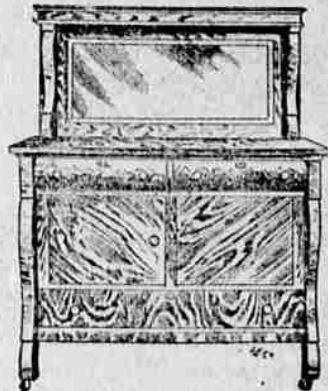

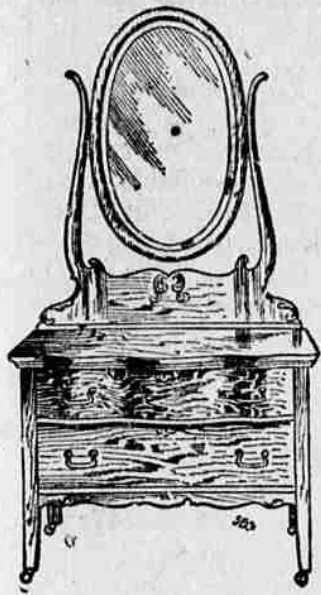

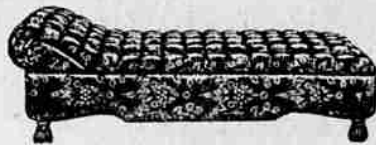

Canned goods of all kinds, sufficient to carry the grocers over the Thanksgiving rush, have been stocked in by wholesale houses here, and the merchants are now loading up their shelves in anticipation of the last-of-the-month rush. At the same time, assurances are given grocers that lettuce, cranberries, currants and other holiday delicacies will be amply supplied them. A few commodities are dropping out of the market, but on the whole the week has been a quiet one in La Grande, insofar as fluctuations in prices are concerned.
