## SCHOOL ACTIVITIES REVIEWED

Assembly was called Tuesday morning, at which time Prof. Olsan renewed his talk on the literary societies to be organized in the school. The plan is to have two societies, one to be composed of the seniors and freshmen and the other to be among the juniors and sophomores. Each society to give a program each month.

After explaining the purpose and stating the plans, Professor Olsan called on several members of the student body to tell what they thought of it, all agreeing that such organizations were needed in the school and the plans proposed were the best possible. On Wednesday the officers of both societies were elected. Those of the seniors-freshmen society: President, Marie Bolton, vice president, Leon Adams; secretary, Ralph Winters; treasurer, Henry Proctor; sergeant-at-arms, Gideon Snook; critic, Miss Hershey.

The junior-sophomore society elected the following officers: President, Merton Westering; vice president, Mattie Schofield; secretary, Frieda Herr; treasurer, Charlotte Jones; Sergeant-at-arms, Lester Stoddard; critic, Miss Hunter.

Under the head of the literary societies will come the debate which is being encouraged to quite an extent among the schools this year. The Oregon Debating league has divided the state into districts, La Grande being in the East Oregon district, which is composed of Baker, Union and La Grande. Each district will fight for the championship among themselves and the winners of the inter-district debate will meet at Eugene to compete for the state championship.

In the La Grande high school each

winning teams will represent La Grande in the debate with Union and Baker. The most of last year's debating teams are still in school and with society will furnish two teams, the two that experience and added material, La Grande fully expects to come up for the state championship.

The basket ball season is just opening and although there has been some practice going on the past week, the organized and heavy practice will not begin until Monday. Among the girls there have been four teams organized. The members of the faculty are taking quite an interest this year, their plans being to have two girl teams and one composed of men.

The boys have not all their teams organized, but will speedily do so. La Grande has turned out some fairly good teams and the intention this year is to turn out better ones.

The freshmen boys are showing their spirit and enthusiasm for basket ball in a practical way—mopping the gymnasium floor. It is hoped that the rest of the school will show the same spirit by keeping off when muddy and heavy shoes are worn.

The manual training department has just finished the five tables for the domestic science room and are now working on a 14-foot table which is to be placed in the library when completed.

Chairs have been ordered for the library, and the intention is to make the library a more essential factor of school life than it has been. Students will be encouraged to use the library for research work and at certain periods of each day it will be turned into a study room.

day as Coach Reynolds and some of the players went to Pendleton to witness the game between that city and Baker. Blue and white hats have become the style this week. Many a noble brow is adorned by such.
