FIRST BIG SHIPMENT WILL COME THIS WEEK

**Creamery Butter Goes Up—Other Commodities Unchanged**  
Sunkist oranges are just about to come into season. One local wholesale house obtained a preliminary shipment a few days ago, but tomorrow or the day after, this house will receive a big lot and the market will be well stocked up. This is the first 1913 crop and the first consignment to reach La Grande. The market opens with oranges retailing at 50 and 60 cents a dozen.

**Butter Goes Up**  
Creamery butter went up today, local dealers being notified of the wholesale price increase. Pound rolls sell at 45 cents.
