Single Women in Business.
Why do single women conduct business more successfully than married women?

And, again, why do married women do better in business than widows? I cannot definitely prove to you that single women do excel married ones in business or that those who have a husband are better business managers than widows. But I have the solemn word—and was ever the word of an English official report anything but solemnity to the 'nth degree?—that such is the fact.

Of 390 women traders who failed in business in London during the past year 155 were widows, 151 married and 84 single. But the average amount of liabilities of the three classes varied greatly. With fewer than twice as many failures the widows had more than three times the debts of the single women. The married women's obligations were two and a half times the ones of those who never knew a husband.—Philadelphia Ledger.
