LUMBERMEN FILE PLEA

PRAY FOR PERMANENT RETRACTION OF ORDER.

Plummer, Spokane and Silver Bow Gateways Defended.

Before adjourning their session last evening to meet here again on December 13, the Eastern Oregon lumbermen adopted the following resolutions:

WHEREAS, the maintenance of a wide distributive market is essential to the permanent welfare, prosperity and expansion of the lumber interests of Eastern Oregon, the lumber and timber interests look with apprehension and disfavor on the avowed attempts of the O. W. R. & N. Co., the sole means of transportation afforded Eastern Oregon shippers, to close the Plummer Gateway, thereby preventing shipments to the Eastern consuming markets via the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Ry., now enjoyed by them. Therefore, the manufacturers of Eastern Oregon desire the maintenance of the Plummer Gateway in order to insure equality in rates and distributive territory enjoyed by the manufacturers of lumber in the Inland Empire.

In former years when the present investments in timber and lumber plants were made, the Eastern Oregon mills enjoyed an exclusive territory covering Idaho, Utah and Colorado. By the granting of concessions in rates and the opening of the Spokane and Silver Bow gateways, the competition from other sections producing the same class of lumber, has been encouraged and fostered, while at the same time the distributive zone for Eastern Oregon lumber has not been correspondingly increased, but rather has been largely restricted.

WHEREAS, the manufacturers of lumber in Eastern Oregon, not only earnestly desire that the Plummer gateway remain permanently open, but that the Spokane and Silver Bow gateways, providing additional competitive transportation facilities via the Great Northern Ry. and the Northern Pacific Ry. and connections, be opened to the product of the Eastern Oregon mills on equal conditions with other competitive producing sections. And,

WHEREAS, the opening of the above gateways is essential to secure and stimulate competition in the matter of service, besides guaranteeing an adequate car supply for the proper movement of our products;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the lumber and timber interests of Eastern Oregon respectfully petition

the Interstate Commerce Commission that the above prayer be granted and that the temporary order suspending the closing of the Plummer gateway be made permanent, and that the Spokane and Silver Bow gateways be opened in fairness and justice to the shippers of this section.

And be it further RESOLVED that the prosperity of Eastern Oregon is inseparably linked with the development of the lumber business—its greatest resource comprising several billion feet of timber which must be marketed very largely in Mississippi river and Atlantic coast territories, requiring the services of several transcontinental lines—and hence the arbitrary restriction to one transportation system does not provide an outlet of sufficient scope to insure its widest and most economic distribution.

And be it further RESOLVED, that the lumber and timber interest of Eastern Oregon invite the co-operation of the various commercial bodies, the agricultural, fruit and livestock industries of Eastern Oregon, in this fight to secure equal rates and a wider zone for the distribution of all products.

And be it further RESOLVED, that copies of these resolutions be forwarded to the various commercial bodies, the State Railroad commission, as well as the Eastern Oregon and state press.

Do You Comply With the BUTTER LAW?

If not, read the following law and have your Butter Wrappers nicely printed, with your name and weight of butter thereon.

CAUTION!

CHAPTER 179, SECTION 3.

"It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, association or corporation to sell, offer or expose for sale, any short weight butter within the State of Oregon. All butter sold or exposed or offered for sale in rolls, prints or squares within the State of Oregon, shall be plainly marked: 'Eight ounces, full weight,' sixteen ounces, full weight,' 'twenty-four ounces full weight,' or 'thirty-two ounces, full weight,' every roll, print or square sold, offered or exposed for sale shall contain the number of ounces marked thereon; and any person, firm, association or corporation violating any of the provisions of this act, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine or not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00, or by imprisonment in the county jail for not less than six months; or both such fine and imprisonment."
