BOY'S DEATH CAUSE OF SUIT.

Statutory Limit Asked in Suit to Recover for Lost Boy.

S. C. Lem, new owner of the Pendleton Roller Mills, was made

defendant in a \$7,500 damage suit today by George W. Riggle, father of Paul Riggle, the five-year-old boy who lost his life on November 3 in the millrace of the milling company. The suit was filed through W. M. Peterson who announced its prepara-

tion for the putting of the millrace underground was at its height. In his suit, the plaintiff sets out that the race is unfenced and unmarked, by reason of which fact it constitutes an unattractive nuisance to children. The untimely death of the little boy has deprived the father of his services and assistance during the remainder of his minority, it is contended, and has thus damaged him to the extent of \$7,500.
