Y-SIX PAIRS TO BE LIBERATED HERE.

Hungarian Partridges Will Be Added to Game Bird Varieties.

Thirty-six pairs of Hungarian partridges will be liberated in Union county as soon as the time is ripe. They will arrive here in a few days, properly crated, and one portion will go to the experiment station at Union and the balance to Walter Pierce who will care for them during the winter. As soon as the time is ripe they will be liberated and add to the variety of game birds that have been "planted" in Grande Ronde valley this summer. Several kinds of Chinas have been set loose, and Deputy Game Warden Chas. B. Orsi has convinced himself that they are growing well and satisfactory.

Jackrabbits are the chief attraction for nimrods right now, though the year saw plenty hunting for grouse and similar birds. Big game was very scarce this year, feeling the effects of greater population of the game's foe.

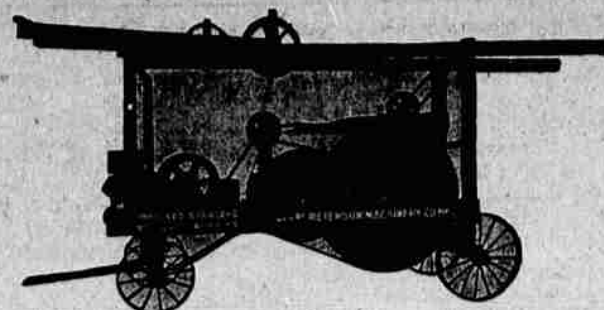
