## NORTH POWDER LOOKING UP

FINE BUILDING COMPLETED IN CENTER OF TOWN.

Wireless Station to Be Operated at North Powder by Amateur.

North Powder, Dec. 23.—(Special.)—The new McGregor building at the corner of E and Second streets is receiving the finishing touches and will be all furnished and ready for occupancy the first of the week. The structure is of gray concrete blocks and is thoroughly fireproof. The first floor contains two large and well lighted store rooms, and the second floor is devoted to sleeping rooms. Artesian water is piped all through the building, with a toilet on the first floor and a toilet and a bath on the second floor. The sleeping rooms are heated and attractively and comfortably furnished, with everything new and of the best. Mr. McGregor has spent money and time without stint to have his building up-to-date and the best in every way. The entire cost of the buildings foots up to over \$12,000. Standing as it does on the best corner in the center of the town, this is a fine addition. On the corner in front is the public watering trough and drinking fountain that Mr. McGregor corner is a fitting monument to the enterprise and public spirit of the owner. North Powder is proud of the building and of the man who had the faith and foresight to add this substantial improvement.

C. D. McCurry & Son have moved their store onto a lot bought from O. D. Thomlinson, adjoining the city hall and just across the alley from their former location. They will build an addition to the store in the future.

The city has traded 80 feet at the south end of lot 4, block 22, to C. D. McCurry for 70 feet at the north end of lot 5, block 22. This gives the city 70 feet by 106 feet on the corner of E and Third streets. The city hall will not be moved until June 1. A proposition is under consideration to sell the present building to the school district for school purposes. If this is done, the city will build a new hall of concrete blocks on the corner of E and Third streets.

North Powder is to have a wireless station, if Operator Wilson of the O. W. carries out his present plans. The receiving set will be sufficient to hear San Pedro, San Francisco, Cabo Blanco, North Head and Seattle, and places at a greater distance, when weather conditions are favorable. The sending apparatus will have a radius of 75 miles in favorable weather, and will talk to the station in La Grande, Union, Medical Springs and Baker. This station will be as near up-to-date as is possible to make it and keep within the law which controls amateur wireless stations.
