EGG MARKET WEAKER NOW

FIVE CENT DECLINE COMES TO LOCAL TRADE.

Lack of Cold Weather May Be Responsible for Big Supply.

Eggs are weaker and the price is down five cents. The flood of fresh eggs is well started, due probably to the favorable weather for poultry, but as mid-winter storms approach it is not unlikely that the supply will diminish, and, probably, prices go up again.
