Second Block of Pocket Billiards is Scheduled For Tonight.

WATER PERMITS TOTAL IS 466

ONE PERMIT ISSUED TO UNION COUNTY APPLICANT.

Figures Issued From State Engineering Office Shows Much Activity.

During the year 1913, a total of 466 permits were issued by the state engineer for the appropriation of water. Under these permits 442, 181 acres will be irrigated, 39,225 horsepower will be developed and 41 reservoirs will be constructed, at a total cost of approximately \$7,000,000.

During the quarter ending December 31, 1913, 88 permits were issued for the irrigation of 6,933 acres and the development of 1,958 horsepower. Among these permits was one issued to F. D. Small of Tillamook, and C. D. Urie of Camas, Washington, for the development of 1208 horsepower with the waters of the Trask river in Tillamook county.

One permit has been issued in Union county the past quarter, to Minnie G. Stevens, et al, of Cove, for domestic use, diverting the water from a spring which is located in Section 16, Township 3, S. R. 40 E.
