ART MARVELS FROM THE SEA

Ancient and Valuable Relics Removed From Sunken Ship Off Tunisian Coast.

Paris.—News has been received of an archaeological find of the greatest interest. At Madhia, on the Tunisian coast, five or six years ago some Greek sponge fishers noticed a strange mass of wreckage lying at a depth of 130 feet to the north of Madhia lighthouse. Amid a jumble of timbers lay splendid marble columns, bronze statuettes, a superb life-sized boy's figure and other treasures, which they succeeded in bringing to the surface.

It has now been ascertained that the sunken ship was a vessel of about 400 tons, 100 feet long and 25 feet broad. She was laden with an extraordinary, heterogeneous cargo, not blocks of marble, but bases and capitals for columns, effigies, statues, furniture, tiles, leaden piping, lamps, amphorae, etc. Among the fragments were found figures of a demigod and a maiden and faun which correspond almost exactly with those upon what is known as the Borghese vase dug up in Rome and now in the Louvre.

The bottom of the hold contains about sixty columns of bluish white marble thirteen feet high, which were probably one of the causes of the wreck of an evidently too heavily freighted ship. All the inscriptions deciphered relate to Attica and personages of the middle fourth century B. C., and it might have been thought that the vessel dated from that period but for the Boethus statue and a lamp of a pattern only introduced into Attica at the end of the second century B. C. Some writing on lead ingots also is in the Latin of that epoch and experts have concluded so far that the vessel was loaded in Attica for Rome and probably the cargo was the spoil after the taking of Athens by Sulla in 86 B. C.

Bells of St. Paul's.

The bells of St. Paul's Cathedral, according to a writer in the British Workman; are rung on Sundays, holy days, and special occasions by twelve members of the Society of the College Youths. To become a member of this society very severe tests have to be passed in campanology. The duty of chiming the bells for the week-day service falls upon Mr. George Harrison, who, by passing the ropes through a series of pulleys and bringing them together, is enabled to chime six bells by himself. He chimes the bells for the 8 o'clock service, starting at 7:45 with two bells for ten minutes, then ringing one bell for five minutes. For the 10 and 4 o'clock services he chimes six bells for ten minutes, then one bell for five minutes. "The ringing of the twelve bells on Sunday morning and afternoon," says Mr. Harrison, "is done by the members of the Society of College Youths, which society has been in existence since 1637. There is no doubt it is one of the finest feats of bells to be found."

Black Bread the Best Diet.

Dr. Kunert of Berlin, one of the highest authorities on food analysis, considers that black rye bread should be the chief item of nourishment of healthy men and women, and maintains that, in earlier times, when the working classes did not eat meat to any extent, but nourished themselves on black bread, leguminous food and groats, they were full of pith, and were strong and healthy. Since meat, wheat bread and sugar became the staples of daily fare their power of resisting disease has sunk. Even for weak stomachs Dr. Kunert prefers black bread.
