HEROIC STRUGGLE LASTS FOR SEVERAL WEEKS.

Measles and the Pneumonia Tear at Elgin Girl's Life Strings.

After a heroic struggle for life, the seven-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Hawkins of Elgin, last Tuesday night succumbed to the ravages of measles and pneumonia. She was first ill with measles and in the course of a week or so developed symptoms of pneumonia. During the last week of her life she was kept alive by artificially supplying oxygen, which, however, was not availing to stave off the grim hand of death.

The little girl was one of the very brightest pupils in school and gave promise of superior talent. She was in the third grade and was progressing rapidly. At home she was an obedient and lovable child and was the favorite of her playmates, all of whom attended the funeral.

The Elgin Knights of Pythias nobly assisted the family during the illness of the beloved daughter and aided in making the last sad rites impressive. Mrs. H. L. Hawkins, Mr. and Mrs. Geo. Kemp and Mr. and Mrs. C. L. Hawkins of this city and Mr. and Mrs. Kirtley of Pendleton, were among the outside relatives who attended the funeral services.

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CHAPTER 179, SECTION 3.

"It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, association or corporation to sell, offer or expose for sale, any short weight butter within the State of Oregon. All butter sold or exposed or offered for sale in rolls, prints or squares within the State of Oregon, shall be plainly marked: 'Eight ounces, full weight,' sixteen ounces, full weight,' 'twenty-four ounces full weight,' or 'thirty-two ounces, full weight,' every roll, print or square sold, offered or exposed for sale shall contain the number of ounces marked thereon; and any person, firm, association or corporation violating any of the provisions of this act, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine or not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00, or by imprisonment in the county jail for not less than six months; or both such fine and imprisonment."
