Notice of the Recorder of the city of La Grande, Oregon, of the assessment of Improvement District No. 82 of the city of La Grande, Oregon.

Notice is hereby given that the assessment for the improvement of Spring Avenue, being Improvement District No. 82 of the city of La Grande, Oregon, under the provisions of Ordinance No. 762, Series 1914. An ordinance declaring the cost of improving Spring Avenue with Dolarway concrete hard surface pavement from the S. W. property line of Washington Avenue to the west curb line of Alder street; determining the property benefitted thereby, levying an assessment thereon to defray the costs and expenses of said improvement; providing for an assessment roll of the same, and directing the entry of such assessment roll in the Docket of city liens; providing a time when the same shall become delinquent and requiring the city recorder to prepare a special assessment roll in accordance with the assessment levied herein, and to collect such assessment, the same being in improvement district No. 82 in said city of La Grande, Oregon, is now in my hands for collection and the same may be paid to me at any time within (10) days from the 20th day of January, 1914, without penalty, interest or cost; and each property owner is hereby notified that on application to the undersigned within ten (10) days from the 20th day of January, 1914, which is the first date of the publication of this notice, they will be allowed to pay such assessment in ten (10) annual installments, the first installment thereof being due and payable on or before the 8th day of January, 1915.

If application is not made as above specified, the whole amount is due, payable and will become delinquent on the 2nd day of February, 1914. The assessment roll is as follows:

NO DOGS IN THE STATE OF SUCH VALUE.

Summary of Assessments of Oregon Dogs Given Out.

An interesting treatise on Oregon dogs is contained in the following dispatch from Salem. If you are a resident of Union county, and if you own a dog, and if it is an average Union county dog, that dog is worth \$50.83.

These respective valuations are set by the respective Assessors of the two counties named and equalized by their respective Boards of Equalization. The figures are taken from the summaries of assessment rolls of Oregon counties, as compelled by the State Tax Commission.

According to the assessor there are more dogs in Yamhill than in any other county of the state. They number 1828. Union county pays taxes on the fewest, six. Multnomah pays property on but 76 dogs, while Curry county, the most sparsely populated pays taxes on 312 dogs.
