NORTH POWDER GIRL DIES

FIVE YEAR OLD DAUGHTER LIVES GAME FIGHT.

Dorothy Richardson, Aged Five, Dies of Typhoid Fever.

Baker, Jan. 30.—(Special.)—Dorothy Jane Richardson, five year old daughter of Mrs. Lillie T. Richardson, died this morning at the home of her grandfather, J. C. Travillion at North Powder, after an illness of two weeks with typhoid fever. The beautiful little child and her sister, Ruth Richardson, who is six years old, were stricken at about the same time. Word from North Powder this morning was that Ruth is also in a critical condition, and but little hope is held out for the little one's recovery. She is also suffering from typhoid fever.

The funeral will be held from Welch & Company's funeral parlors here today at 2:30 o'clock, Rev. E. P. Waltz conducting the services. Burial will be in Mt. Hope cemetery.
