"INSIDE THE CUP" TO BE REVIEWED.

Portland Church Worker in the City to Help Baptists.

Sunday evening Rev. E. B. Fyke D. will review Winston Churchill's latest book, "Inside the Cup." The volume is a criticism on religion and the question of whether or not it is a just criticism will be the topic of the address. The book has created a wonderful interest, the local volume in the library being many weeks behind time so great is the demand.
