HAY PRICES READJUSTED

SUPPLY OF HAY STILL PLENTIFUL GENERALLY.

Unusual Amount of Range Facilities Increase Salable Hay.

Considerable readjustment in hay and grain prices has taken place of late. Baled alfalfa hay is bringing an average of \$8.75 f. o. b. the cars and timothy, under similar circumstances bringing about \$12.00 while wild hay is quoted at \$8.00 even.

There is considerable hay in the fields that has not been moved and hay-producing centers of Eastern Oregon generally report a tremendous amount of it unsold. There has been plenty of feed and for the most part the ranges have been freely used this winter, leaving more than usual amounts of hay for sale.

The week opens with Club and Forty Fold wheat bringing 75 cents clear locally, and Bluestem some better than that.

In the grocery line, changes are few.

Eggs Down Slightly.

Ranch eggs have dropped to 30 cents, and the two-pound butter roll has decreased in price to 65 cents with no change in price for the one-pound roll.

HAINES BANS "RAG" DANCES

MORAL WAVE SWEEPS OVER CITY COUNCIL.

"Rags" Called Dangerous to Morals—Pool Halls Licensed.

Haines, Ore., Jan. 30.—A great moral wave swept over Haines this evening, when the new council put a ban on "rag" dances and also passed an ordinance requiring pool rooms to take out a license and prohibit boys under the age of 18 engaging in any play, either pool, cards or other of the games, either for pastime or for stakes. The ordinance to prevent further "ragging" at dances reads in part:

"That it is, and is hereby declared to be the sense of the Common Council of the town of Haines that that form and manner of dancing commonly known as 'ragging' is dangerous to the health, morals and welfare of the inhabitants, especially to the youth of the town of Haines, and from and after the passage and taking effect of this ordinance it shall be, and hereby is declared to be, unlawful for any person or persons to engage in that form and manner of dancing in the town of Haines, commonly known and called 'ragging.'"

The ordinance carries a fine for violation and provides in addition that the violator "shall be publicly reprimanded by the court."

The pool room ordinance provides in addition to licensing, that they shall not be open on Sundays, this action coming after considerable agitation. Justice Pierce recently acknowledged he could not cope with the situation and wrote the governor, but received no reply. The ordinance in the matter of Sunday closing is generally favored, but there is some feeling between the various factions, some desiring that the pool rooms be kept open on the Sabbath.

The pool room and dance hall ordinances are the most important steps taken by Mayor Biswell and the new council since their assuming office.
