STATE SENDS ELECTION LAWS

SECRETARY COMPILES BOOKLET
FOR VOTERS.

Those In Need of Election Laws Can
Obtain Them From Salem.

For the convenience of such persons as may become candidates for nomination or election for any state, district or county office at the ensuing primary elections during the current year; for the information of those officials, both state and county, who have to do with the administration of laws pertaining to nominations and elections, and for the guidance of such persons or organizations as may sponsor any measure proposed by the initiative, the secretary of state has compiled a digest of the existing laws of the state relating to elections in Oregon.

Prior to the primary election in 1912, a similar publication was issued, which afforded much information to the various state and county officials, newspapers and candidates for nomination and election during that year.

Having in mind the usefulness of and demand for the previous issue, a digest of the existing election laws for 1914 has been compiled in similar form, copies of which have been forwarded to La Grande. Additional copies may be had upon request.
