POTATO HAS BIG WEAKNESS

WHOLE PACIFIC COAST IS EMBRACED IN WOBBLING.

Eggs Higher In Portland, Onions Unchanged and Smelt Run Light.

Portland, Feb. 3.—(Special).—Extreme weakness is continued in the potato market. While all sorts of prices are being quoted in the California trade, it is noted that local representatives of that trade are not willing to buy supplies at all the moment.

Nominally the buying price for extra fancy potatoes at Oregon country points is 90c a cental, f. o. b. shipping stations. This is an extreme quotation and it is doubtful if more than one or two buyers would care to take hold of any supply at that figure.

The market is even duller than it is weak. With the California trade filled up with its own growth as well as Oregon and Washington stock with a sprinkling of Idaho potatoes, buyers there have about all the stock they can take care of at this time.

The produce business in Portland is lined up as follows:

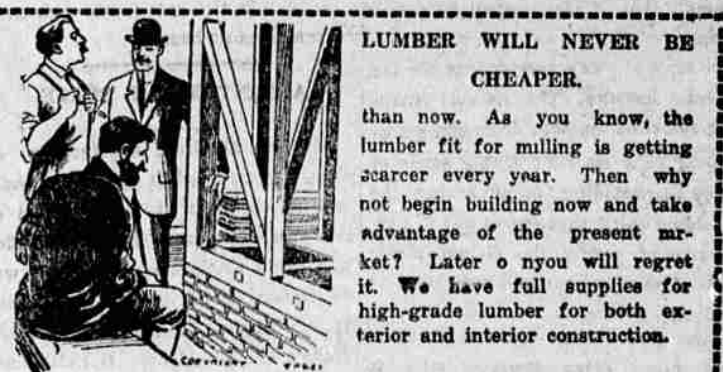
