GIRL MINSTRELS ARE GLASSY LOT

Grace M. Russell's minstrel maids conquered a half-sized audience at the Arcade last night with a sparkling line of dances, comedy stuff and singing. The maids make up a real minstrel show—ensemble with its interlocutor, end men (no end women), olio and one-act farce. The show is here again tonight and deserves a "standing room only" sign at the door. It carries a snap and a sparkling line of offerings that make it classy in spots. The ensemble is dry in spots, though it is short, but for all that, the jokes did not all originate on the ark. The main show commences with the olio and American interpretation of the tango. Mayme Prager and Flo Russell, comedy stuff exponents are just about as clever damsels as are given supporting companies in the big headlines. They are winsome and cute and active and have the stage mu h of the time. Mildred Manning stands alone in classic dancing. As a danseuse she has few equals and her presentation of the Egyptian and Spring dances, set off with rich costumes, were classical features of the show. Miss Prager, Miss Tomkins and Miss Estella Prager put something worth while into the show with their "Classy Girls" number, rich gowns and clever acting making at a tremendous hit. The one-act number puts Miss Russell, who performed so admirably in the ensemble work, in the feature work, and she is a winner in it. She does a boy's part, and does it well. Roma Scott is a soprano who has no business with a little 12-year old minstrel show. She is good—fine. Speaking of singing, there are others who are good, but hardly up to her caliber. E. P. Pergram, the piano player, is the only man with the show, but he is a marvel both with the piano and in a vocal number sung from the pit. Then comes the so-called finale, the "Tango" dance which is boosted as an interpretation of Evelyn Thaw's famous dance. Of the two interpretations given the Argentine is by far the prettier, the American carrying more dash but less grace and beauty. Tonight the company drops the curtain with a presentation of sketches from all the known rags, but last night a Chinese song and dance by the company rolled down the good night curtain. With the five leading characters, each head and shoulders above comic opera stars of the road variety, and the rest of the company fairly good, the show is made to bristle with something different and often—

times something really classic. No wonder the company has had a remarkable run, for it has something to offer and can "come back" with a repeater. It is advertised as the "girl show different," but "good" should have been a part of the slogan.
