TAX MATTERS RECITED

Crawford Again Explains What the Tax Law Requires.

In further explanation of the muddle some Western Oregon papers recently started over the tax question, Attorney General A. M. Crawford writes to Tax Collector Frawley as follows:

Those taxes are all due April 1st. If one half is paid April 1st, the other half may run until September 1st by the payment of one per cent penalty each month. (I think I called it interest before.) If paid between April 1st and May 1st, one percent is added; between May 1st and June 1st, two percent; between June 1st and July 1st, three percent; July 1st to August 1st, four percent; August

1st to September 1st, five percent. Therefore if paid September 1st, five percent, is added to the last half only. If not paid September 1st, then an additional ten percent penalty is added, and the whole amount bears interest at the rate of twelve percent per annum until paid. I wish you would circulate this in your county that tax payers may not be misled to their injury.

Tax Receipts Will Be Mailed.

An impression has gotten out that no tax receipts would be sent out this year. County Treasurer Frawley wishes it understood that he will have all of the tax receipts mailed by next Monday and that it will not be necessary to call at the office for them.
