SUGAR CHEAPER BY TEN CENTS

NEW QUOTATION OUT TODAY IN LA GRANDE.

Lemons Have Tendency to Fall Off in Top Prices.

Ten cents off the price of sugar is about the only item of moment in regard to market quotations today. This cut brings the cash price for the 100-pound sack to \$5.25 and the beet sugar sack, cash, correspondingly lower. The 50 cent grade of lemons is about exhausted and 40 cents is about the top price everywhere this week. Other commodities remain as before.
