Mr. Trill is in La Grande today on legal matters and while here announced his candidacy, promising to publish his detailed platform within a few days. Trill's announcement warms up matters perceptibly in the joint representative race. Dr. Maher, republican of Wallowa is already in the race and W. L. Jones republican of Joseph is a reputed candidate. The triangular affair promises a lively scramble and of course all look to Union county to swing the battle as the break in Wallowa county will more or less be an even break.

Mr. Trill is a progressive. "I am a consistent progressive in every way" said Mr. Trill, "but it is a fact nevertheless, that a state representative has his district's interests to look after more than a party interest. These two counties need certain kinds of legislation, and what the constituency wants should be worked for by progressive, republican and democrat or independent."
