STATE GAME JOB PEEVES

SWITCHING OF MEN STARTS TROUBLES.

Lostine Man Goes to Salem to Become State Game Warden of Ore.

State Game Warden Evans and family moved to Salem this week where he will assume new duties.

At a meeting of the State Game and Fish Commission held at Salem recently, Cliff Evans of Lostine, who less than a month ago was appointed one of the five members of the commission, was elected State Game Warden. He immediately resigned as a member of the commission and no one has yet been appointed to fill the vacancy.

The board also created two new game and fish jobs. Mr. Finley, formerly state game and fish warden, was appointed superintendent of the educational and biological department and R. E. Clanton superintendent of hatcheries. The salary of each will be \$2400 a year—\$700 a year less than the salary paid to Mr. Finley as game and fish warden. Theodore Opsund, clerk of the commission, was appointed Master Fish Warden. The salary of Mr. Evans and Mr. Opsund will be \$2100 a year for each. The increase in aggregate salaries is therefore \$1000 a year.

This increase does not meet with the approval of Governor West—or for that matter, with the taxpayers of the state, who have been clamoring for a reduction instead of an increase in the expense of the game and fish commission. Unless the expense for maintaining the game and fish commission is reduced from what it is now—nearly \$140,000 a year to \$100,000 a year steps may be taken to have the entire game and fish commission abolished. Taxpayers figure that it is going it entirely too strong for the expense to grow from \$44,000 in 1911 to nearly \$140,000 in 1913.

SPORT NOTES.

While at La Grande recently Prof. J. J. Beaty of Wallowa, purchased the bowling alley balls and pins for the new school gymnasium.

Twenty-four pairs of Hungarian quails or pheasants were sent to Wallowa county this week from the state game farm at Salem. Half of them were liberated at the Sam Wade place near Lostine and the other half at the Paul Wilson place just below Joseph. Next month another shipment—500 pairs—will arrive from Hungary, and then about 50 more of them will be liberated.

Speaking of the game between La Grande high school and Joseph high last Saturday night the Joseph Herald says among other things:

The game was by no means as one-sided as the score might indicate 37-11. The La Grande captain was a veritable demon, scoring from the most difficult angles. At center Capt. Wells often outjumped his opponent and Allen was a constant source of annoyance to those playing opposite him. He was hard to keep track of. In fact every man on our team did excellent work. The game was fairly won by our opponents but not because we have not a good team; it was because we were opposed by an unusually fast team. Too much credit cannot be given the visitors for the clean, aggressive skillful game they played. The game was fast, and rivalry keen, throughout, but there was no unnecessary roughness displayed. The friendly relation already existing between the two schools has been greatly strengthened.

In the second series for the Observer trophy the team captained by Scott defeated Williams' team in an interesting match last night. Only four men were used in the lineups of the teams and some good scores were rolled. Kohl, Zimmerman, McLeod and Frees rolled well for the winners while Wickline, Van Fleet and Williams were in good form for the defeated bunch. Monday night, Crowe's team and Williams' will roll to see who holds the cellar in the league race.

A goodly number of fans got together last Saturday night at Elgin for the purpose of doing all possible at the present time towards the or-

ganization of baseball for the coming season, and the meeting was a success in every way. Not only was the attendance good, but all present took an active part and the baseball for 1914 is started under the most auspicious circumstances.

A. E. Oswald was re-elected manager, and a board of directors was chosen from business men to have the general supervision of things. A number of La Grande men have expressed themselves as anxious to see a league organized on the branch line, and assure the promoters that La Grande will be well represented.

Monday evening the Wing, Fin & Fleetfoot club will hold a meeting to discuss the advisability of sending a representative to Portland March 13 to participate in the formation of a state wide sportsman association. All members should be out.
