SEX HYGIENE REAL PROBLEM

MEETING THURSDAY TO HEAR
IT DISCUSSED.

Social Hygiene Rated as One of the
Most Serious Problems.

Local professional men, parents and citizens in general, are looking forward with a great deal of interest to the social hygiene meeting for men at the commercial club next Thursday evening. Dr. Andrew C. Smith and Dr. Calvin S. White, both well known Portland physicians, and members of the state hygiene society, are to be present. A local man interested in the welfare of the society and the cause, said today in urging attendance of as many men as possible:

"This conference is upon such a vital subject that it will cross all political and religious lines.

"The campaign is upon a state wide basis. Oregon is leading in this constructive work and our community must do its part to maintain their leadership.

"Sooner or later problems of sex confront every one of us.

"A careful discussion of the subject and a source of reliable information

should appeal to every parent particularly.

"This question of social hygiene is one that reaches down into mankind far more deeply than any of our serious problems. Before real progress can be made in its solution mothers and fathers will have to appreciate the seriousness and the far reaching effects.

"False modesty and prudery will have to be banished and men and women will have to face facts equally important to both.

"Physicians will tell the people that more sickness and suffering is caused from sexual vice and its ramifications than from any other cause.

"The responsibility rests with mothers and fathers. Shall we not realize our responsibility and gladly cooperate in the solution of the problem."

assessment thereon to defray the cost and expense of said improvement; providing for an assessment roll of the same; directing the entry of such assessment roll in the Docket of City Liens; providing a time when the same shall become delinquent; and requiring the City Recorder to prepare a special assessment roll in accordance with the assessment levied herein, and to collect such assessment, the same being in Improvement District No. 60 in said City of La Grande, Oregon, is now in my hands for collection and the same may be paid to me at any time within ten (10) days from the 26th day of February, 1914, without penalty, interest or cost; and each property owner is hereby notified that on application to the undersigned within ten (10) days from the 26th day of February, 1914, which is the first date of the publication of this notice, that they will be allowed to pay such assessment in ten (10) annual installments, the first installment thereof being due and payable on or before the 18th day of February, 1915.

FOR SALE—NEAR COVE.

On account of old age and poor health, I will sell my fine 200-acre farm, known as the Grande Ronde Orchard farm, either all together or part of it in tracts of 40 acres and up, as follows: One 40 north side, half of which is set to the Delicious variety of apples, three year old trees, the other half is in fine timothy and a few acres of plow land. This 40 for all cash down can go for \$115 per acre. One 40 facing on county road; nearly all in four year old commercial apples, some land ready for grain, and grain or garden or clover can go between trees; this 40 for \$125 per acre, \$3000 cash down; and one 40 also facing on county road, all in five year old commercial apples, and alfalfa, for \$125 per acre, half cash down; or the whole 200 acres for \$24000, \$10,000 down, balance terms at 7 percent interest. This farm is all of deep, black, sub-irrigated loam soil, with no waste land on it and lays fine for platting into small tracts. There are fine springs, a flowing well, buildings, shade, a full bearing family orchard of apples, pears, peaches, plums, prunes, cherries, berries, etc. and all kinds of grain including corn, also tender vegetables such as beans, tomatoes, melons, celery, etc., has been raised in abundance there. Anyone wanting any of this land with the young orchards left on it had better not delay for they will nearly all be plowed out by March 1, and the land seeded to grain.
