EGGS DROP TO THIRTY CENTS

GREENS PLENTIFUL AND SELLING WELL LOCALLY.

Wool and Mutton Prices Indicate Splendid Year in State.

Local Market Conditions.
Fresh eggs down to 30 cents.
Butter firm and plentiful.
Onions rise to 6 cents per lb., small lots.
Spinach, rhubarb and green onions of good quality and selling well.

Not only is the outlook good for fair prices for wool this spring but indications also point to higher prices for sheep than were paid in 1913. Some buying has already been conducted at optimistic figures and it is said buyers will be here in considerable force in about 10 days.

There is going to be quite a demand for Oregon sheep on the part of Dakota interests this spring and this same thing was true a year ago. The sheep will be taken to the Dakotas, held during the summer and winter, being turned off next spring.

R. F. Bicknell, who was recently reported to be buying sheep and wool in Morrow county and as having offered two cents more for wool than was paid a year ago, has denied offering any such price. Parties who are informed say this is true but that Mr. Bicknell, while not as eager to contract wool as was reported, was nevertheless in the market for sheep.

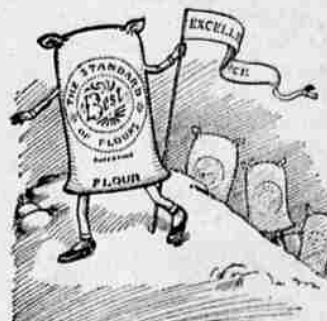
