BUTTER NOT WEAK LONGER

EXPECTED DROP NOT COMING AT THIS TIME.

Instead, Rise is Due—Local Shippers Arrive at Stockyards.

While in certain quarters in Portland there has been more or less talk of a further loss in the price of butter here, such action is not considered likely by the trade at this time. In fact conditions are generally considered strong and it would not be surprising if an advance was forced instead of a decline, say Portland chiefs of butter trade.

The retail price on butter did not vary in La Grande during this period of uncertainty in Portland markets. The expected drop didn't come and now of course, is no longer expected. Following are market conditions as found in Portland today:

Egg market holds. Chickens are firm. Halibut sells low. Country meats firm. Onions rule weaker. Cheese stocks scant. Vegetables from the south. Hop market weak. Butter may rise. Among the shippers who delivered shipments to the Union Meat Company yesterday were J. E. Reynolds and M. R. Goodnough, both of this city. Mr. Reynolds had three carloads of beef cattle and Mr. Goodnough a carload of hogs.

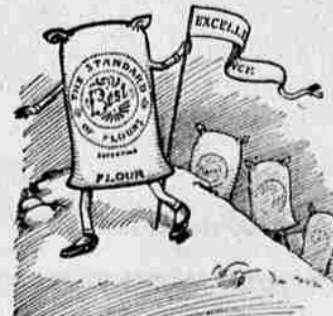
