Fresh Mexican tomatoes, not many days off the vine, are now one of the regular offerings of local grocers. A few days ago some of the grocers experimented with a few pre-season tomatoes, and found that they are justified in putting a more regular line on. The Eastern Oregon Produce company brought a shipment to town yesterday afternoon.

Green peas, California grown, selling at 25 cents a pound, are likewise here, probably for keeps, for the quality is very good for this early in the season.
