WHEAT CROPS PROMISE MUCH

EASTERN OREGON PREDICTIONS ALL BRIGHT.

Big Farms of Umatilla County Show Fine Stands of Wheat.

Wheat-producing districts of Eastern Oregon are reporting very fine wheat crop indications. Not only is this a fact in the Grande Ronde valley but the bigger territory of Umatilla county has bright prospects in view. The Pendleton East Oregonian relates in this connection:

G. N. Lacy was in Tuesday from his farm nine miles southwest of town. He has about 400 acres of wheat and about 40 acres in barley. Mr. Lacy reports his crop as good as any he has ever raised up to this time of year, as a whole and he says he has twenty acres in what that is so much better than the average that there is no comparison.

W. D. Chamberlain of the Pacific Coast Warehouse company, reports that there are only 4000 sacks of barley and 2000 sacks of wheat left in that company's Pendleton warehouse. During the season the warehouse handled about 12,000 sacks of wheat and 25,000 of barley. This company maintains twenty houses in the county and last season handled over a million bushels of grain.
