EVANS COMING MONDAY NIGHT

PRESIDENT ZIMMERMAN RESIGNS FROM GUN CLUB.

Directors Meet to Hear Report from Delegate to Portland Meeting.

Dr. Geo. W. Zimmerman last evening tendered his resignation as president of the Wing, Fin & Fleetfoot club to take effect immediately. The directors, in session last evening, accepted the resignation and elected J. M. Kohl as president.

In addition to acting upon the resignation of the president who has recently commenced his second term, being the first executive, elected over a year ago when the club was first formed, and serving with a great deal of attention to the club's welfare, the directors heard the report of Chas. B. Orai who was sent to Portland to attend the formation of a state-wide sportsman's association. That much

good will result from the state association, was the belief expressed by Mr. Orai. Geo. W. Zimmerman, of this city, was elected vice-president of the club interchanging with Mr. La Dow of Pendleton, who was at first vice-president. In the end, Mr. La Dow was made director and Mr. Zimmerman vice-executive.

The directors last evening decided that when State Game Warden Evans and Floyd Bilyeu, chairman of the game commission, reach here from Joseph Monday evening, the local club will serve a luncheon in the officials' honor. At that time the sportsman's situation in this county will be discussed with the officials. The Minam dam question will be one of the matters taken up on that occasion.
