STATE EXHIBIT IS ON DISPLAY

OREGON HYGIENE SOCIETY IS SPONSOR.

Exhibit Which Figured at State Fair, Comes to La Grande.

Exhibits prepared by the state of Oregon and now in the hands of the Oregon Hygiene society, dealing with hygiene problems and questions, were put up in the West-Jacopson building at Elm and Adams today and at stated periods will be on exhibit until Monday night and probably Tuesday.

This is the same exhibit that attracted such wide attention at the state fair at Salem last year. In groups, it deals with questions of hygiene. Admission is free and each day, except Sunday, the building will be open from 11 to 9:30 and the exhibit arranged. Sunday the hours are from 1 p. m. until 9:30.

Earl Cummings field secretary for the association, is in charge of the exhibit and all are welcome to visit it.

The exhibit shows by means of charts, cartoons and other displays, the character and seriousness of venereal disease, causes and remedial measures under the following topics.

Veneral disease and marriage.
Typical cases.
Blindness in children.
Conditions in Portland.
Quackery.
Juvenile impurity.
How one boy was educated.
Popular songs.
What is meant by sex education.
The ever-recurring miracle of birth.
Sex—a subject of nobility, purity and health.
Regimen.
The value of athletics, out-of-door life, and other recreation.
The importance of the home.
These subjects are treated with dignity and care so as not to offend sensitive women and young people.
