

PERSONAL INVITATION WILL ADMIT TO O. A. C. SCHOLASTIC

New Scheme Hit Upon—News of Sporting Activities in La Grande and Vicinity.

Corvallis has hit upon a unique and appropriate method of selecting its athletes for the interscholastic to be held there May 22. The La Grande students to get to go, will be selected by the Corvallis management on the strength of the championship meet at Wallowa, May 6, and personal let-

ters of invitation are to be sent to each individual. That letter alone will open the portals to the Corvallis meet. All expenses will be paid by the school, and gold, silver and bronze trophies will be hung up. Highest point winner is to be rewarded with a handsome cup. The interscholastic is part of a three-day carnival to be held in Corvallis. Letters explaining the methods to be followed, were received in La Grande today.

Harold Peet, the Sumpter boy, who La Grande tried to land for the Tri-state league last year, is getting off well with McCredie at the training field.

A Sumpter Valley league is about to be formed. Somewhat, it depends on Baker, but without Baker it will be Sumpter, Whitney, Prairie City, Canyon City, John Day and Austin. Games are to be played on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays.

Tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock, every aspirant for the La Grande semi-pro team is urged to be out to limber up. Suits are not necessary, but in order to get started there must be a start. C. C. McCormick is being suggested as business manager of the La Grande team and he has consented to taking the responsibility if a team is put in the field.

Three championship meets are in prospect for La Grande high school cinder sharks this year. The first is May 6, at Wallowa, when the Eastern Oregon championships will be staged; the second is the big track event of the season at Eugene, May 9, when the Oregon interscholastic championships will be staged at the University of Oregon campus and the third at Corvallis as a part of the three days' athletic carnival, May 22, 23 and 24.

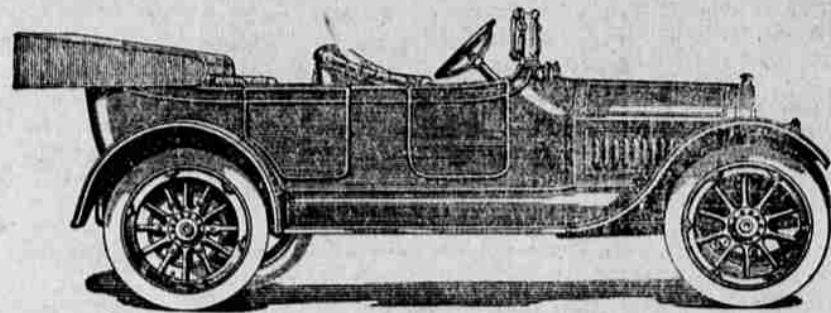

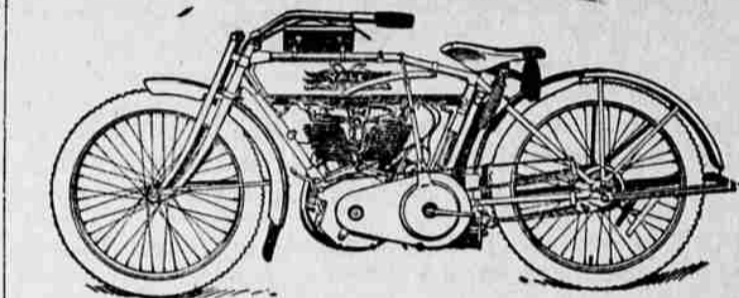
