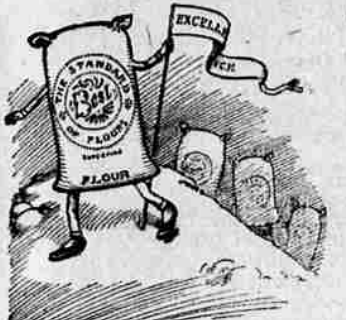

LICENSE CLERK BOOKS COME

GAME WARDEN SUPPLIES
CLERKS WITH LICENSES

Several Towns of the Valley have
Hunting License Dealers.

Some time ago the Observer made mention that the deputy game warden W. E. Leffel, had made arrangements whereby parties desiring hunting, fishing or combination licenses could obtain them from parties he had selected for the various districts of the county. The appointment of these men was made by himself and not by the county clerk and their work was to begin with the arrival of the necessary books from the department headquarters at Salem. The books are now here and today Mr. Leffel distributed them to the various men chosen to do this particular work.

It will therefore not be necessary now to come to the county clerk's office to obtain this license as the men whose names follow are empowered to issue them and receive the license money. In this way persons are saved the expense of the trip and will have little or no excuse for not providing themselves with the license as required by law. The following are empowered to issue the licenses:
