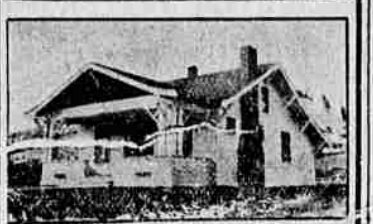
The fourth semi-monthly shoot of the Wallowa County Gun club was held at Lostine last Sunday.
