PENDLETON'S HOTEL GROWS

EXTENSIVE IMPROVEMENTS
ARE NOW UNDER WAY.

Lessee for New Building at Pendleton
Undermined to Date.

Pendleton, March 31.—(Special)—

With the contract let only few days ago, work has already started upon the reconstruction and addition to the Hotel Pendleton and it is the intention of J. S. Winters, the contractor, to push it with all possible haste. His contract calls for the completed building by September 1 and he contemplates having it ready to turn over before that date.

The first work to be done is the installation of the heavy supports necessary because of the additional two stories to be added. Work will then be started toward remodeling the first floor. The barroom will be moved first. The space occupied by the present barroom is to be thrown into the lobby and the new barroom will occupy the space where the stairs now are. The remainder of the present lobby will be converted into a barber shop.

With work started, the question of interest now is the matter of selecting a lessee. A number of hotel people have been considering making the company an offer and within a few days several are expected here personally. The company will receive all propositions and give them consideration, according to Secretary Moorhouse, and expects to make the lease within a short time.
