OPEN BIDS FOR THE Y MONDAY

BUILDING COMMITTEE EXPECTS GOOD RESULTS.

Finishing Product Should Be About \$10,000 Above Average.

Next Monday at noon, the directors of the Y. M. C. A. will open bids for the construction of the new Y. M. C. A. building on Elm and Washington. Forty thousand dollars were raised by public subscription last year, but of that amount incidentals and site had to be cared for so that the building will not amount to \$40,000 but it is expected that a building of more than ordinary size will be erected. Thirty thousand is the average contribution toward both site and building, and the local "Y" when ready should be in the neighborhood of \$10,000 larger and better than the general run of association buildings in the Northwest. As soon as expedient construction will commence, and if the bids Monday carry an item that is satisfactory, the construction will be a very near-by event. The basement is practically complete, work on it having started last year and finished last month, except for a few minor details.
